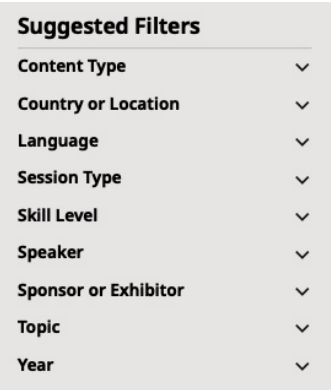


Best of Rootstech
